Welcome Back, CMS Families! The CMS Guidance team is excited to start the 2023-2024 school year! Counselors will continue to be assigned to a grade level again this year: Kyle Skinner (6th grade), Katie Manquero (7th grade), and Melissa Robison (8th grade). We look forward to building relationships with students and helping them navigate their time in middle school and beyond. Part of that process is assisting students with any questions they or their parents have regarding academic, social, or emotional well-being. If you have questions or concerns about your student's schedule, feel free to call the school office and leave a message with your counselor, or send an email. We are here to help provide support in any way that we can as we get ready to start a new school year together.

As we all know, middle school years come with many changes. Those changes must be navigated with teamwork and communication. We cannot emphasize enough the importance of these two concepts when working toward the goal of a student's academic, social, and emotional progress. This requires the combined effort of students, parents, teachers, counselors, principals, and other building staff. CMS is blessed to continue having two full core teams of teachers in all three grade levels; each with their own team leader. Our design for teaming is to make a school of almost 1,000 students feel smaller. Each team has approximately 170 students they monitor, manage, and mentor. As you know, phones and access to social media are now considered the "norm" by many of our students. With this, we have seen a huge rise with inappropriate postings and pictures on social media. Often times what happens outside of school on platforms such as Instagram, Snapchat, and Tik Tok is shared at school and disrupts learning. FEES-IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Effective July 1, 2023 legislation passed stating that schools may no longer charge parents/guardians for curricular materials, including textbooks, curriculum of any kind, consumables, and any other fees related to classroom instruction. The school corporation will no longer send out fee statements for curricular material/book fees. Families will continue to be responsible for damage to school items such as computers, textbooks, equipment, band, uniforms, etc.

Notes From the Nurse

6th Grade vaccinations need updated – must have Tdap and Meningitis before school starts—give paperwork to office. There are many options in the community to receive these shots. Doctors offices, pharmacies, Super Shots, Allen County Health Department and Parkview Ronald McDonald Care Mobile Unit to name a few.

Medication at school – All medications are to be kept in the Nurses clinic – unless we have a permission note on file from a physician that it can be a self-carry med. This includes inhalers.

Each school year, all daily and as-needed medications need to be reestablished. Medication Permit Forms are located online and in the CMS office.

Health Care Plans need to be updated every school year. If you have a student with any health issues that we need to be aware of, please fill out and turn in an updated care plan.

	Free/Reduced Meal Assistance Information
	Free/Reduced Assistance applications from the 2022-2023 School Year will expire on September 24, 2023. You must fill out a new application each year or be qualified through Direct Cert.
	Applications for Free & Reduced meals for school year 2023-2024 will be taken after July 1, 2023 at https://nacs.familyportal.cloud . The link for that site will be available on July 1,2023 on the Food Service website. Paper applications will also be available at the school offices after July 1, 2023 as well as during onsite registration.
	The Direct Certification process is a computer matching system which we use to match students in our database with those currently receiving some Medicaid, TANF or Food Stamp (SNAP) benefits. We send all matching families a letter stating their approval and the students that will receive benefits. Should you receive a letter and a student is not listed, please contact our office at (260) 637-8768. Direct Cert approval letters should be received prior to registration if you were qualified for SNAP benefits prior to our matching process. If you do not wish to receive these benefits please sign the letter, state that you wish to decline benefits and return it to our office.

Northwest Allen County Schools Device Protection Plan 2023-2024

Northwest Allen County Schools' optional Device Protection Plan provides full coverage for the first accidental damage claim and offers assistance to families in managing expenses due to accidental damage.

What is covered?

- This Device Protection Plan covers the NACS laptop or Chromebook, adapter, and case.
- The plan will provide <u>full replacement cost coverage for one incident claim per school</u> <u>year</u>, per student covered, at no additional cost to the family.
- If a student device is accidentally damaged a second time during the covered school year, the plan will discount charges by 75% and the student will be charged 25% of the cost of the replacement part (approx. part costs listed below).

What is not covered?

- Damages deemed by administration to be intentional are not covered by this plan and the student will be charged the full cost of the repairs or device replacement. Intentional damage might include breakage and the removal of parts, including screws, keys, or rubber bumpers.
- Loss or theft of the device is not covered by this program. The student is responsible for the full replacement cost if the device is lost or stolen.
- Students will be charged the full cost of replacement parts after the second incident claim during a covered school year.

Program Enrollment:

- The cost of the program is an annual, non-refundable fee of \$25, per school-issued device.
- Coverage begins upon receipt of payment and this signed agreement. Coverage ends when the device is returned at the end of the school year or upon withdrawal. If the device remains with the student over summer break, coverage ends at the start of the first day of the new school year.
- To enroll in the program after September 1, the device must first be inspected by the school media assistant
 or the NACS Technology Department and any needed repairs must be made at full cost before coverage will
 go into effect.
- As this is an optional program, fees for students on a free or reduced lunch program are not discounted.

It is the student's responsibility to protect the device from damage, loss, or theft. All repairs must be handled only by the NACS Technology Department.

Repairs deemed by the NACS Technology Department to be due to device defects or issues that would normally be covered under a manufacturer's warranty will be made at no charge to the student, regardless of participation in this program and will not count against claim limits.

• Approximate cost for common parts and resulting charge to student with and without this plan:


