Physical Education I (Semester for Credit)Note:** Students will receive a high school credit for this class. The semester grade a student receives will be placed on their high school transcript.** This course emphasizes health-related fitness and development of skills and habits necessary for a lifetime of activity. This includes skill development and the application of rules and strategies of complex difficulty in at least four of the following different movement forms: (1) health-related fitness activities (cardiorespiratory endurance, muscular strength and endurance, and flexibility), (2) aerobic exercise, (3) team sports, (4) individual and dual sports, (5) outdoor pursuits and (6) recreational games. Ongoing assessment includes both written and performance-based skill evaluations. *Note: This course is required to meet graduation requirements for all diplomas*.

Preparing for College & Careers (Semester for Credit)Note:** Students will receive a high school credit for this class. The semester grade a student receives will be placed on their high school transcript.** This course addresses the knowledge, skills, and behaviors all students need to be prepared for success in college, career, and life. The focus of the course is the impact of today's choices on tomorrow's possibilities. Topics to be addressed include twenty-first century life and career skills; higher order thinking, communication, leadership, and management processes; exploration of personal aptitudes, interests, values, and goals; examining multiple life roles and responsibilities as individuals and family members; planning and building employability skills; transferring school skills to life and work; and managing personal resources.

Algebra I: We highly recommend students and parents review math pathways available at CHS. High school credit will be awarded for each semester of this course if a passing grade is earned. CHS encourages students to have a minimum of an A-/B+ average in 8th grade or students will be recommended to retake Algebra I in 9th grade.

Geometry STEM: Due to the importance of fully understanding basic Algebra skills, students taking Algebra I in 7th grade should have a quarterly average of at least a "B+" and teacher recommendation to take Geometry STEM as an 8th grader; otherwise, Algebra I should be retaken. High school credit will be awarded for each semester of this course if a passing grade is earned.

Accelerated English 8: This pre-advanced placement course is intended to prepare students for future honors-level and advanced placement English courses. Students will be engaged with in-depth and rigorous coursework that focuses strongly on analyzing and synthesizing a variety of texts. The writing focus in this course will teach students how to write for varied purposes while preparing them for writing in advanced courses in the future.

Spanish I: Students who desire to take Spanish I should have a B- or higher quarterly average in English 7. High school credit will be awarded for each semester of this course if a passing grade is earned. *Note: CMS reserves the right to move students to Study Hall who are enrolled in Spanish but failing core classes during their 8th grade year.*

Semester Electives--General Music 8: (1 semester) This course develops basic music literacy in the areas of music theory, music concepts and music history. Students will have the opportunity to play rhythm instruments, xylophones and hand chimes, as well as the possibility of basic guitar skills in the 2nd quarter of the semester. **Technology Integration: (1 semester)** This is a course in which design becomes reality through hands-on projects using various tools and techniques. *Students will take one of these courses in the first semester and the other second semester*.

Peer Tutoring: (1 semester) Students in Peer Tutoring participate in assisting students in the applied skills class for one period each day. This experience provides students with the ability to explore opportunities in the field of special education. Classroom grades are based upon both participation and reflective writing assignments. The counselor will select the other semester elective for the student.
